# **Backpacks**

Parents, following our communication in July, please be advised that children should not have backpacks.

This is due to a lack of space in the school now that we have 510 pupils.

Instead, pupils should bring their lunch, water bottle and reading record/book in a drawstring bag.

Pupils should also have a drawstring bag for their PE kit.

We also will not have keyrings or similar items which hang from bags. We cannot, unfortunately, assure that these are kept safe. We have had items go missing previously which is distressing for children.

The school has a small supply of drawstring bags which we can sell for 50p. Please be advised that we do not make a profit from this.



We are increasingly concerned about the impact of smartphones on our children, in-line with many other schools in Hampshire. Acknowledging the alarming amount of evidence and research about the negative effects of smartphones and social media, we are committing to making Hampshire primary schools smartphone free.



Please note that your child will not be permitted to have a smartphone in school, regardless of their transport home. "Brick" phones without internet connectivity may be accepted on a case-by-case basis.


In addition, we ask for your support in making the school mobile phone free in general.

We had a huge and positive response from children following No Mobile May; we want to continue this opportunity to greet your child with a smile.

Our school expectation is that children read at least three times a week. This can be a mixture of their reading book, school library book or any book they enjoy reading at home. Please ensure this is recorded in their reading record. Please note that this applies for children in every year group.

Please remember: children are free to borrow books from our in-school library or using the SORA app run by Hampshire library service that the school has paid the subscription for. On this platform, children can borrow a range of books including comics and audio books. Your child will be given their login again in September. Please also remember that it is free to sign up to Aldershot library where children can borrow additional books. The



most important thing you can do to support your child's reading is to talk to them about their books. Please see the questions to help you.

We are very excited to welcome Mrs Beasley to Talavera Junior School as our focused Speech and Language Support. She will be of a huge benefit to children who may be struggling with a wide range of needs associated with communication.

If you think your child would benefit from support, please do get in contact with us so that you can discuss this in more detail with our SENDCo, Mrs Embleton-Horner.

## Pastoral Support

We are so proud to announce that Mrs Cluness and Mrs Hatton will be expanding their Pastoral Support Team roles. They will now be able to support a larger number of families.



They will be able to continue using their skills in ELSA, Bubble Time, Drawing & Talking and TALA in order to support your child.

In addition, they will be expanding their Family Support Worker roles, in which they can provide help directly to families in areas such as routines, behaviour management, bereavement and emotional understanding.

#### What can you do at home?

If your child is finding something difficult at home, please do reach out for support if you feel you need it. We use Zones of Regulation at school which support emotional understanding and develop children's confidence in using the



language of emotions. It can be beneficial to implement these at home too. Let us know if you would like help in doing this.

All children need to be confident in their times tables—they are the foundation of a huge amount of other learning. Your child's teacher will let them know if they need additional practice. Watch out for your child's TT Rockstars log-in.

Your child's teacher may also give you flashcards to further assist them. Thank you for your support in using these regularly. Please note that, if your child wants to cycle or scoot to school, we encourage this. However, they must ensure they are wearing a helmet and cannot cycle or scoot on school grounds.

Please come to the school office to get a cycling/scooting permit. These will be signed by Mrs Harman-Box.



This year, we will operate a three strikes system to ensure that child are safe. Thank you for your continued support. Being Talavera Smart is important in helping your child understand their role and responsibility at our school. Here is a guide to our uniform. If you need support with your child's uniform, we are here to help.





Red school jumper (can be branded from Edgar Jerome)

White polo shirt Black skirt, shorts or

trousers

Leggings are not school uniform.



Indoor PE: red or white t-shirt (plain or Talavera-branded) and black shorts

Outdoor: as above, with red or black jumper. Leggings or tracksuit bottoms can be worn. Socks and trainers.

#### Jobs and responsibilities

We have a number of roles which children can take on to help develop their independence, confidence and resilience. These include:

Talavera Ambassadors: These students welcome new entrants and help them to acclimatise to life at Talavera. They receive training in Makaton to assist in this.

Librarians: Children who are passionate about reading often thrive in this role which includes supporting children in choosing new books and organising the library.

School Councillors: These students are chosen through a democratic election process and have real say in the school.

Prefects: Available to year 6 only. These students are role models for the rest of the school.

Eco-Councillors: If your child is passionate about protecting our environment, this the role for them.

House Captains: Available to year 6 only. These students are team players, often love sports (but not always!) and can bring people together.

Junior Road Safety Officers: These students promote safety in our school and in our local environment.

Our school library will continue to open before and after school this year! Mrs Opoku (our librarian) will be opening the library every Monday at 8am until 8:30am and every Thursday from 3:20pm until 4:00pm.

This means you will be able to support your child in choosing books to enjoy at home and have a space where you can sit, read and chat with your child about one of our favourite things at Talavera: reading!
