Talavera Smart uniform reminders:

At Talavera we continue to have high expectations for school uniform. Please ensure your child is following the correct dress code in line with our uniform policy.

Please see below for key reminders:

- Children are only permitted to wear one pair of earrings which must be studs. These must be removed or tape must be provided on PE days.
- Children should be wearing black school trousers, a skirt or a dress daily. Leggings and jogging bottoms are not permitted.
- Children should wear a white polo shirt which is different from their PE top.
- Nail polish and temporary tattoos must be removed before coming to school.
- Hair, which is shoulder length or longer, must be tied up.
- A red cardigan or jumper should be worn in school. Hoodies are not part of the uniform policy.
- Children need to wear plain, black shoes. Please see the examples provided and contact us if you're not sure

If you are experiencing any difficulty providing your child with suitable uniform, do not hesitate to speak to Mrs Webb or the office and the school will assist you. Remember we also have our second hand uniform trove which is available when requested at the school office.

Remember to save outgrown uniform as we are having a Mufty day on Monday 22nd July to replenish our uniform trove.



Summer reminders

Please be aware that the heat both within and outside the classrooms is steadily increasing. For this reason, it is vital that your child comes into school with a water bottle. Please also ensure that all your child's uniform (including their jumper) is named to ensure they can quickly be returned to them if they are lost. Finally, we understand the year is coming to an end; however, please ensure that children are coming into school in the correct school uniform (including appropriate PE kit). When it becomes hot, it is also vital to ensure your child comes to school wearing sun cream; they also may find a cap more comfortable to wear in the playground too.
