

HOMEWORK

The children have got off to a good start with their homework. As part of their preparation for year 6, we will now be monitoring this more consistently. If homework is not handed in, then they will go to homework club on a Friday lunchtime to complete. This sets them up to be secondary ready and develop independence and responsibility.

In Year 5, homework consists of a weekly English task (paper sheet) and their orange book that is used to practise arithmetic questions the teacher sets them. We can also set children a weekly my maths as extra but we are going to be focussing on the orange books and improving arithmetic skills. These will be set on a Friday and due in the following Thursday.

5 'rule breakers' or tricky words will be sent home on a Monday; the children are expected to write these down and take them home. We also ask that you continue to practise times tables recall with your children regularly and continue to use TT Rockstars.

Finally, we ask that you ensure they are reading either a school book or a book from home at least 3 times per week and they complete a double page spread in their scrap book every 2 weeks.


